1.1 Direct Bullying

Examples of behaviour that may be considered **Direct Bullying** includes but is not limited to:

- physical or verbal abuse or insults against a colleague
- Use of intimidation, manipulation, and/or unreasonable and persistent criticism to obtain a favour from a colleague
- Senior Registrar belittling, or making offensive and degrading remarks against a Junior Registrar
- yelling, screaming, or use of offensive language
